Dear Voter,

Due to the limited number of registered voters, from the Truitt Precinct and the Fairfield Harbour Precinct, who are eligible to vote in the First Craven Sanitary District Election, to be held November 8, 2011, and in an effort to save the First Craven Sanitary District the added expense of opening two additional polling locations, the Craven County Board of Elections has issued the following:

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY TRANSFER OF VOTING PRECINCT

Pursuant to North Carolina General Statute §163-128(a), the Craven County Board of Elections unanimously resolved to temporarily transfer for the purpose of voting in the November 8, 2011, First Craven Sanitary District, Non-Partisan Election, voters from Precinct #12 (Truitt) and Precinct #20 (Fairfield Harbour) to Precinct #11 (Bridgeton).

If you are receiving this letter, you are currently registered and eligible to participate in the November Election. You are also assigned to either Precinct #12 or Precinct #20. Precinct 12 voters ordinarily vote at the Little Swift Creek Fire Department, Cayton Substation at 2580 Aurora Rd, in Ernul, NC, and Precinct 20 voters ordinarily vote at the Fairfield Harbour Fire Department & Community Center at 589 Broad Creek Rd. in New Bern, NC.

For the purpose of the November 8, 2011 First Craven Sanitary District Elections, you will vote in Precinct #11's polling location on Election Day. The polling location for Precinct #11, the Bridgeton Precinct is the Tri Community Fire Department at 200 Saints Delight Church Rd. in New Bern, North Carolina.

One Stop Early voting for this election will be held October 20, 2011 through November 5, 2011 in the County Administration building and Absentee by mail ballots will be available, through written request, beginning October 7, 2011.

This **transfer is temporary** and will expire at 12:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 9, 2011. Questions concerning this temporary transfer can be directed to the Craven County Board of Elections at (252) 636-6610.




1. Head northeast on Broad Creek Rd toward Blue Heron Dr

**RESOLUTION TO TEMPORARILY RELOCATE VOTERS FROM
PRECINCTS ELEVEN (12) AND TWENTY (20) TO AN ADJACENT
PRECINCT FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2011, FIRST CRAVEN SANITARY
DISTRICT ELECTIONS.**

WHEREAS, the Craven County Board of Elections has the authority upon a resolution adopted by the county board of elections and approved by the Executive Director of the State Board of Elections to temporarily transfer voters from a given precinct, for the purpose of voting, to an adjacent precinct. N.C.G.S § 163-128(a); and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Craven County Board of Elections have identified four-hundred-eighty-nine (489) voters qualified to vote in the November 08, 2011 First Craven Sanitary District Election in Precinct Eleven (12).

WHEREAS, the staff of the Craven County Board of Elections have identified four-hundred-thirty-two (432) voters qualified to vote in the November 08, 2011 First Craven Sanitary District Election in Precinct Twenty (20).

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Craven County Board of Elections, in agreement with the members of the First Craven Sanitary District Board, hereby orders the temporary transfer of voters, *voters qualified to vote in the November 08, 2011 First Craven Sanitary District Election*, for the purpose of voting in the *November 08, 2011 First Craven Sanitary District Election only*, who are assigned to Precinct Twelve (12) and voters who are assigned to Precinct Twenty (20) to the adjacent polling place location for Precinct Eleven (11).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN pursuant to G.S. 163-33(8); the registration books will close on Friday, October 14, 2011, at 5:00 p.m., for the Non-Partisan Municipal Elections to be held on November 8, 2011 in the County of Craven, North Carolina.

Elections will be held for Mayor and/or Members of the governing bodies for the Towns of Bridgeton, Cove City, Dover, River Bend, Trent Woods, Vanceboro, The First Craven Sanitary District and the City of Havelock,.

Absentee ballots are allowed for all elections except Cove City, Dover, and Vanceboro. Requests for absentee by mail ballots may be made in writing and received in the Craven County Board of Elections office no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 1, 2011. Voted absentee by mail ballots must be received in the Craven County Board of Elections office not later than 5:00 p.m. on November 7, 2011. One-stop voting for all Municipalities except Cove City, Dover, and Vanceboro will be held in the Board of Elections building located at 406 Craven Street, New Bern, NC, beginning October 20, 2011, and ending at 1:00 p.m. on November 5, 2011. One-stop voting hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m., and on Saturday, November 5, 2011, from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

The absentee review board meetings will be held at 5:00 p.m., at the office of the Craven County Board of Elections, located at 406 Craven Street, New Bern, NC, on October 18, 2011, October 25, 2011, November 1, 2011, and November 7, 2011. The Board will meet at 5:00 p.m. on Election Day at the office of the Craven County Board of Elections to conduct the absentee tally. Results will be released at 7:30 p.m., when the polls close.

Canvass will be held at 11:00 a.m., at the office of the Craven County Board of Elections, on November 15, 2011.

Absentee Voting

Any Craven County voter may vote absentee (during Municipal Elections absentee may or may be permitted as per Municipal charters). There are two methods: **Absentee by mail and Absentee one-stop (in-person)**.

Absentee by Mail

Any registered North Carolina voter can request an absentee ballot from his/her respective county board of elections prior to 5:00 pm the last Tuesday before the election (Please note, the request must be IN the Elections office by 5:00 pm). A handwritten request from the voter or near relative* must include the following:

- ✂ **Name of voter**
- ✂ **Residential Address of voter**
- ✂ **Mailing Address of voter (if different from residential address)**
- ✂ **Date of Birth of voter**
- ✂ **Signature of voter or near relative (indicate relationship with voter)**

If a near relative is requesting the ballot they must include their name, relationship and address with the request.

**A near relative is a: spouse, brother, sister, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, mother-in-law, father-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, stepparent, or stepchild*

If the voter is qualified, an application and ballots will be mailed to the voter after the receipt of the written request. The voted ballot must be received in the County Board of Elections office by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the election in order to be counted.

Absentee One-Stop

Voters may choose to vote in person during One-Stop Absentee Voting which begins the third Thursday before the election and ends the Saturday prior to the election. Voter registration is available with appropriate identification at One-Stop locations.
