community water and sewer. The Planning Board reviewed and recommended the park for final approval.

Neuse Point East Phase IV – Final: The property, owned by J.M. Stallings and O.L. Humphries and surveyed by Strickland Surveying, is located within Twp 5 off of SR 1768 (Shadyview Beach Road). The subdivision contains 5 lots on 2.96 acres and is proposed to be served by community water and individual septic systems. The Planning Board reviewed and recommended the subdivision for final approval.

PETITIONS OF CITIZENS

Mr. Richard Henry appeared to appeal the most recent tax revaluation on his parcel #9-048-003. He indicated that he had already appeared before the Board of Equalization and Review, and presented a chronology of those meetings and communication with the Tax Department. Mr. Henshaw advised the Board that the valuation received on March 11, 2002 represents a 47% increase over the previous value, and that subsequent adjustments raised the value an additional 35%. He stated that he did not receive a direct response from the last meeting with the Board of Equalization and Review; however, on September 28th he received a tax statement that did not reflect a change. He inquired about the method which is used to determine use value, and requested assistance in reducing the value. He stated his belief that there are inequities with valuation of comparable properties. The Chairman indicated that the Board would review his documents and put his request on the agenda for October 21, 2002.

Byrd Henshaw requested that Craven County join the lawsuit against the State of North Carolina for sequestered funds and asked that the Board make a decision immediately. At the request of Commissioner Phillips, County Manager, Harold Blizzard, provided an update from the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, in which he stated that the Association had engaged a law firm to investigate the feasibility of a lawsuit against the State. He reported that the law firm, Tharrington-Smith, rendered the opinion that the likelihood of prevailing against the State was not good. The Chairman went on record to express his intention, personally, not to file suit against the State, and it was the consensus of the Board that to do so would be non-productive.

REQUEST TO SET PUBLIC HEARING TO EXPAND ZONING ORDINANCE

The Planning Department requested that the Board set a public hearing for November 4, 2002 at 7:30 p.m. to amend and expand the County's Zoning Ordinance. Don Baumgardner, Planning Director, and Joe McKinney, Executive Director of Eastern Carolina Council of Governments, presented information from the AICUZ study. The presentation outlined the area in question and the Board was advised that the amendment to the zoning ordinance is being sought to update the compatibility with the AICUZ. Commissioner Toon moved to set the public hearing, as requested, at 7:30 p.m. on November 4th, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried.

PUBLIC HEARING ON ROAD ADDITIONS AND NAME CHANGE

At 7:45 p.m. Commissioner Sampson moved to go into public hearing, as advertised, concerning a road name change and road additions, seconded by Commissioner Phillips. There were no members of the public present to speak and Commissioner Toon moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Phillips. Commissioner Toon moved to approve the proposed name change of Lagoon Road to Old Airport Road in Twp 7 and additions of Lathan Lane within Twp 3 and Premier Drive within Twp 7. Commissioner Sampson seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BOARD OF EDUCATION REQUEST

Mr. David Clifton, Assistant Superintendent of Craven County Schools, updated the Board on the projects funded with the \$28 million school bond and requested that the Board approve a transfer from the School Board general fund to the Capital Outlay fund

to cover the project cost. He explained that the total project cost was \$27,207,000, with \$25,841,000 being available from bond revenues. The balance remaining in the amount of \$1,366,000 was the amount requested to be transferred to Capital Outlay. Commissioner Sampson moved to approve the transfer, as requested, of \$1,366,000 from the School Board general fund to Capital Outlay, seconded by Commissioner Toon and unanimously carried in a roll call vote.

HARLOWE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT PROPOSAL FOR ACQUISITION OF NEW EQUIPMENT

Fire Marshal, Stanley Kite, presented a request on behalf of Harlowe Volunteer Fire Department to purchase a new fire engine. The new fire truck will cost \$169,260.00, in addition to items to outfit the truck totaling approximately \$32,000.00. The price for the truck and equipment is \$201,260.00. The department proposed to finance the truck with a loan from First Citizens in the amount of \$145,000 for six years at 4.35% and to use a CD that has matured for the down payment. Commissioner Toon moved to approve the request, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried.

APPOINTMENTS

Industrial Facilities Pollution Control Financing Authority

The Board was informed on September 16th that the term of Mr. Fletcher Watts is due to expire. Commissioner Sampson nominated Mr. Watts for reappointment. Commissioner Phillips moved to close nominations, seconded by Commissioner Toon, with Mr. Watts being reappointed by acclamation.

Jury Commission

The Board received a correspondence from the Clerk of Court requesting that an appointment be made for Jury Commissioner, as the term of Mr. George Griffin is expiring. Mr. Toon nominated Mr. Griffin for reappointment. Commissioner Sampson moved to close nominations, seconded by Commissioner Talton and unanimously carried. Commissioner Toon moved to suspend the rules to waive the one meeting waiting requirement, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried.

COUNTY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

County Attorney, Jim Sugg, reported on a closed session briefing that occurred on September 16th. He reported that the County settled a lawsuit for \$750,000 concerning the intensive livestock moratorium that was brought by Forest Edge Farms. He advised that the entire settlement was paid by the County's insurance carrier and that the matter has been concluded.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

Dead Animal Transfer Facility

County Manager, Harold Blizzard, reported to the Board that the Livestock Association, which had previously utilized the dead animal transfer facility, has been disbanded. As requested by Commissioner Tyson it was established that there would be no future use of the facility. He recommended that the City of New Bern be allowed to dispose of it as was requested of the Board on September 16th. Commissioner Talton moved to dispose of the dead animal transfer facility, as requested, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried.

Cooperative Extension Service Director Recruitment Process

Mr. Blizzard advised the Board that the Cooperative Extension Service is in the process of reviewing applications to fill the position of the Director of Craven County

Cooperative Extension. He asked if the Board wished to participate in the process after the Extension Service makes a preliminary recommendation. The consensus among the Board was to allow the staff to handle the process.

Local Option Sales Tax

Mr. Blizzard provided the latest information from the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners on the recent legislation to accelerate the additional one-half cent local option sales tax. He advised the Board that ample notice would be required if there are plans to consider a resolution to levy the tax. Commissioner Toon moved to direct the County Attorney to draft a resolution to be considered at the Board's next meeting on October 21st and staff to give the required 48 hours notice. Commissioner Talton seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Commissioner Phillips stated that the Global Transpark was originally intended as a cargo jetport and that the current effort to introduce passenger airport service at Global Transpark is in violation of the original, twelve-county agreement. He recommended dissolution of the Global Transpark Authority and invited Craven County's Global Transpark Commission representatives to the next meeting to discuss the matter.
