Following an invocation by Commissioner Morris and the Pledge of Allegiance, Commissioner Sampson moved to approve the minutes of August 21, 2006 regular session, seconded by Commissioner Brown and unanimously carried.

CONSENT AGENDA

Request for Releases of Late Listing Penalties

Craven County Tax Administrator, Ronnie Antry, submitted two requests for release of late listing penalties. Sickle Cell Month Proclamation

As is done this time each year, the Board was requested to proclaim September as "Sickle Cell Awareness Month" in Craven County by adopting a proclamation. Commissioner Sisk moved to adopt the following proclamation proclaiming September as "Sickle Cell Awareness Month" in Craven County, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried in a roll call vote.

 SICKLE CELL AWARENESS MONTH
 IN CRAVEN COUNTY**

WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is an inherited blood disorder that causes pain, infection disability, economic strain and even death among African Americans and other groups; and

WHEREAS, about one of every 294 African American North Carolinians is born with sickle cell disease and one out of every 10 has sickle cell trait, meaning that he or she carries the gene for this condition. No cure for this disease exists, though treatment is available to help those with sickle cell lead more productive and rewarding lives; and

WHEREAS, since 1973, the North Carolina Sickle Cell Syndrome Program has provided quality services throughout the State. Provision of services is a collaborative effort between regional educators/counselors, community-based programs, major medical centers, local health departments and the State Laboratory of Public Health. Services include screening of all newborns at birth, general screening by request for the public at local health departments, education, genetic counseling, service coordination, medical reimbursement and social support for affected persons; and

WHEREAS, support for research on the treatment and management of this disorder is vital to improving the health and quality of life of persons with sickle cell disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Craven County Board of Commissioners proclaims September 2006 as “**SICKLE CELL AWARENESS MONTH**” in North Carolina, and urges our citizens to recognize and support this observance.

PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING THE NAMING OF A PRIVATE ROAD

Planning Director, Don Baumgardner, presented remarks prefacing the public hearing, which was set at 8:30 a.m., to hear comments regarding the naming of a private road within Twp. 9 off of Hillard Road. Property owners requested that the road be named Bryant Lane and a petition was signed and submitted by all parties signifying their compliance with the amendment of the Craven County Road Naming and Addressing Ordinance. At 8:39 a.m. Commissioner Brown moved to go into public hearing, as advertised, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried. There were no speakers from the public other than an inquiry by Mr. Charlie Simmons to clarify the location of the road. At 8:40 a.m. Commissioner Brown moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Sampson and unanimously carried. Commissioner Sisk moved to approve the naming of the road Bryant Lane, seconded by Commissioner Brown and unanimously carried.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES MATTERS

Social Services Director, Kent Flowers, requested that the Board schedule a public hearing for October 16 at 8:30 a.m. to receive public comment on the proposed Work First Block Grant plan. In addition, he presented a slate of nominees for appointment to the Work First Planning Committee. Commissioner Sisk moved to set the public hearing, as requested, for October 16 at 8:30 a.m. and to appoint the nominees as presented to the Work First Planning Committee. Commissioner Brown seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

PHONE BIDS FOR THE HUMAN SERVICES COMPLEX AND HUMAN SERVICES ANNEX

Planning Director, Don Baumgardner, presented bids that were received for the replacement of the phone system at the Health, Social Services, Veterans Services, Water, Inspection, Planning and CARTS Departments and the Social Services Career Center. Three older phone systems are being replaced by approximately 390 telephone handsets. The bids received were as follows:

It was recommended the bid be awarded to low bidder, Business Communications Systems in the amount of \$240,996, which does not include \$24,002 for maintenance over five years. Mr. Baumgardner also asked that the Board consider budgeting up to \$250,000 to cover unforeseen contingencies. Commissioner Brown moved to approve award of the bid to Business Communications Systems of NC in the amount of \$240,996 from Capital Reserve with one half to be contributed by the Health Department and one half by the Department of Social Services, and to approve a budget allocation up to \$250,000 from Capital Reserve. Commissioner Tyson seconded the motion, which carried unanimously in a roll call vote. Mr. Baumgardner explained that the bid for maintenance of the system over five years would be budgeted in the years in which the expense would occur.

FIRE DEPARTMENT MATTERS

Fire Marshal, Stanley Kite, presented a request on behalf of the Cove City, Fort Barnwell and Dover Fire Departments for funds to match state grant monies that have been awarded. There was discussion concerning correspondence to the fire districts dated May 30, 2006, advising them to budget for potential matches within the district’s current year budget. Commissioners made inquiries to establish the need for the equipment being sought through the grant funds and Mr. Kite indicated that the listed equipment is necessary for the departments to maintain their departmental ratings. In addition, it would be available for use in other areas of the County if needed. Representatives of the three departments emphasized the disparity between their fire district and other districts in the County, both in the fire tax rate and the property values. For this reason, they asserted that they were not unable to budget matches for this needed equipment. Commissioner Tyson established that he would be willing to support the request if there is a need. Commissioner Sampson indicated that, although he initially was not in favor of granting the request, he would be willing to support it after reconsideration. Commissioner Allen stated that the Board needs to be mindful of the fact that any appropriation made is funded by the entire County. He expressed the expectation that the Board would be equally amendable to supporting similar requests from other squads or departments. Commissioner Sisk moved to appropriate the funds in the amount of \$54,240.81 from fund balance to provide a match for the anticipated grants, seconded by Commissioner Tyson and unanimously carried in a roll call vote.

Board of Health

The Board received a request from the Health Director for an appointment to replace Suzanne Pryor as the pharmacist member of the Health Board, as Ms. Pryor is leaving the area. Commissioner Sampson nominated Trey Paul of Realo Pharmacy to fill the position. There were no additional nominations and Mr. Paul was appointed by acclamation.

At 9:20 a.m. the Board went into recess and reconvened at 9:30 a.m.

ABC BOARD REQUEST

Mr. Ray Hemphill, General Manager of the Craven County ABC Board, presented a request that the ABC Board be authorized to establish a separate fund for the development of a larger warehouse facility. He explained that North Carolina statute allows establishment of such a fund; however, the approval from the appointing authority is required. Commissioner Allen moved to approve the request of the ABC Board to set up a separate account for a building fund, seconded by Commissioner Staton and unanimously carried.

INNER BANKS SCENIC PARKWAY PROPOSAL

Mr. Dean Stephens, resident of Washington County, made a presentation about the Inner Banks Scenic Parkway proposal that has been submitted to the Department of Transportation. He explained that the basis of the request is the identification of three state funding sources that are currently available, as follows:

- Funding to replace ferries with bridges
- Funding for new state parks
- Funding for environmental/ecosystem protection

He stated that the proposed scenic parkway would have elements of all three initiatives.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Commissioner Sisk recognized River Bend Town Council Member, Brenda Garvey, who attended as a representative of Leadership Craven.

Commissioner Staton commended the Havelock Fire Department for their initiative in seeking a reduction in the fire tax in Township Five by requesting a review by the state.

Commissioner Allen reported on the presentation which he made at the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners conference and advised the Board of related upcoming activities.

Commissioner Sampson reported on the Duffest that was held over the weekend and credited Duffy Field Residents' Council and area volunteers for its success. He asked that the public continue to bring pressure for continued lowering of gas prices.

Commissioner Morris highlighted the Band Days proclamations that the Board had adopted and invited the public to attend the upcoming Band Days at Havelock High School and West Craven High School. He also noted the passing of Mr. Gus Kite.

At 10:10 a.m. Commissioner Sisk moved to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Staton and unanimously carried.
