B. TAX RELEASES AND REFUNDS

Craven County Tax Administrator, Ronnie Antry, submitted the routine requests for tax releases and refunds contained in Attachment #3.B. for the Board's approval.

There is one large release request for Irene R. Overman Heirs that warrants some explanation. The 2011 tax bill in the amount of \$13,490.33 includes \$12,305.00 for a nuisance abatement lien for the City of Havelock. This lien, along with the taxes, were extinguished when Craven County and the City of Havelock became the owners of the property as a result of the foreclosure action.

C. ROAD ADDTION RESOLUTUION

Attachment #3.C contains a road addition resolution requesting the Board of Commissioners to approve Lynden Lane, Palisades Way and Quincy Court located in Lynnwood Highlands Subdivision to be turned over to the State of North Carolina for maintenance. DEPARTMENTAL MATTERS: SOLID WASTE – DISASTER DEBRIS CONTRACTS

In September of 2011, Craven County entered into a three year contract for Disaster Debris Removal and Clearance Services and Disaster Debris Monitoring Services for storm debris generated from Hurricane Irene. These three (3) year contracts have an option to extend for two (2) additional one (1) year periods upon mutual agreement of both parties. In August of 2014, County Commissioners approved an extension for these contracts for one additional year. On April 17, 2015 Craven County sent out an RFP for Disaster Debris Removal and Clearance Services and an RFQ for Disaster Debris Monitoring Services with a deadline for responses on May 15, 2015 by 10:00 a.m.

Craven County has evaluated these proposals through a forced matrix format using specific evaluation criteria. (See Attachment #4)

If approved, the resulting contract term will be for forty-two (42) months with the option to extend the contract for two (2) additional one (1) year periods upon mutual agreement of both parties.

We request that the Board of Commissioners accept the recommendation of the evaluation committee and approve and execute a contract with Phillips & Jordan, Inc. for Disaster Debris Removal and Clearance Services and Tetra Tech, Inc. for Disaster Debris Monitoring Services.

The County may terminate these contracts without cause by written notice.
