Five Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-One (5,861) votes were cast FOR State constitutional amendment reducing the voting age to 18 years and providing that only persons 21 years of age or older shall be eligible for elective office.

AGAINST AMENDMENT

(Number of votes in words and figures)

Three Thousand Seven (3,007) votes were cast AGAINST State Constitutional amendment reducing the voting age to 18 years and providing that only persons 21 years of age or older shall be eligible for elective office.

FOR AMENDMENT

Six Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-Four (6,354) votes were cast FOR constitutional amendment to require the General Assembly to prescribe maximum age limits for service as a justice or judge.

Two Thousand Twenty-One (2,021) votes were cast AGAINST constitutional amendment to require the General Assembly to prescribe maximum age limits for service as a justice or judge.

Six Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-Eight (6,378) votes were cast FOR constitutional amendment authorizing the General Assembly to prescribe procedures for the censure and removal of Justices and Judges of the General Court of Justice.
