Navigating the Road to Recovery

- **Disaster survivors who received initial rental assistance from FEMA may be eligible to apply for more help.** To apply for continued rental assistance, they will need to:
 - Complete an Application for Continued Temporary Housing Assistance.
 - If they do not have one:
 - Call the disaster assistance helpline at **800-621-3362** or **800-462-7585** (TTY).
 - Or visit a disaster recovery center. To find center locations and hours, visit FEMA.gov/DRC.
 - Submit supporting documents with the completed application to prove ongoing need.
 - Return the completed form and supporting documents to FEMA:
 - Take them to a disaster recovery center.
 - Upload them to their disaster account at DisasterAssistance.gov.
 - Mail them to FEMA, PO Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-8055.
 - Fax them to **800-827-8112**.
- **More than \$500 million has been paid** by the National Flood Insurance Program on claims made by more than 14,800 policyholders.
- **Are you staying in a home without heat, or outside in a tent or other temporary shelter?** You can use your FEMA funds for a hotel room. If you do get a hotel room during this cold snap, keep your receipts. This will serve as proof that the FEMA assistance was used as intended, and also help to show a continued need for housing help.
- **Have your housing needs changed since you registered with FEMA and now you must temporarily relocate?** Let us know. Call **800-621-3362**. Deaf/hard of hearing can call **800-462-7585** (TTY).

- **Have you been told to vacate your storm-damaged apartment complex**, whether your unit had damage or not? You may be eligible for disaster assistance. Take these four steps:
 - 1) Register for disaster assistance. Call **800-621-3362** or go online to DisasterAssistance.gov.
 - 2) Give FEMA a copy of your notice to vacate. Fax, mail or upload a copy of the notice. Write your nine-digit registration number on every page.
 - Fax: **800-827-8112**
 - Upload: DisasterAssistance.gov online account
 - Mail: FEMA, P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-8055
 - Disaster Recovery Center: Stop by in-personProvide additional documents, such as:
 - Proof of Residency
 - Lease Document
 - Driver's License
 - Utility Bill
 - 3) Keep all receipts related to your forced relocation.
 - 4) Stay in touch with FEMA. Call **800-621-3362**.

SBA disaster loan application deadlines

The deadline for filing an SBA application for low-interest disaster loans for physical damage as a result of Hurricane Florence has been extended to Thursday, **Dec. 13, 2018**. The deadline to return economic injury disaster loan applications is **June 14, 2019**.

Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA)

The [Transitional Sheltering Assistance](#) program provides short-term hotel stays to survivors who were displaced from their homes and need shelter while they look for longer-term housing. Survivors will be notified of their eligibility through an automated phone call, text message,

and/or email depending upon the method of communication they selected when they registered for assistance. Or call the disaster assistance helpline at **800-621-3362** or **800-462-7585 (TTY)**.

- TSA is available to eligible survivors whose pre-disaster primary residence is in one of the following *nine* counties: **Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Jones, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender or Robeson.**

Direct Temporary Housing Assistance

FEMA is providing Direct Temporary Housing Assistance in **13** counties: **Bladen, Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Duplin, Jones, Lenoir, Onslow, Pamlico, Pender, New Hanover** and **Robeson**. Travel trailers and manufactured housing units are provided for eligible households displaced from their homes.

Disaster Tax Relief

Survivors of Hurricane Florence may qualify for tax relief from the Internal Revenue Service. Taxpayers may be eligible for deadline extensions to file returns or pay taxes, and may be able to claim qualified disaster losses. The IRS may waive fees and expedite requests from survivors. U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

Disaster Unemployment Assistance

If you're out of work or lost income due to Florence, and reside in **Chatham, Durham and Guilford Counties**, you may be eligible for Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA). DUA helps those who do not qualify for regular unemployment benefits—such as farm laborers and self-employed workers. To apply, call **866-795-8877**. Chatham, Durham and Guilford residents have until tomorrow, Nov. 28, 2018. For more information, visit the state's [Division of Employment Security](#) website.

Unmet Needs

FEMA works closely with state, federal, faith-based and voluntary agency partners. Survivors who do not qualify for FEMA disaster assistance may call **2-1-1**, the statewide information and referral service for basic unmet needs—such as food or cleaning supplies and help to pay utility bills and child-care expenses.

National Flood Insurance Program

- To help speed recovery, the [National Flood Insurance Program](#) is allowing advanced payments to policyholders on their flood insurance claims.
- Policyholders who contact their insurer can receive an advance payment of up to \$5,000 on a flood claim, without an adjuster visit or additional documentation.
- NFIP policyholders who have not yet filed a claim should call their agent or insurance company and file immediately. Policyholders who need assistance contacting their insurance company can contact the NFIP Call Center at **800-427-4661**.

Public Assistance

- FEMA's Public Assistance program provides grants to state, local and tribal governments, and to certain types of private nonprofit organizations so that communities can quickly respond to and recover from major disasters or emergencies.
- The following **51** counties are now eligible to apply for all categories of Public Assistance: **Alamance, Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Cabarrus, Carteret, Chatham, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Dare, Davidson, Duplin, Granville, Greene, Guilford, Harnett, Hoke, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Madison, McDowell, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Orange, Pamlico, Pender, Person, Pitt, Polk, Randolph, Richmond, Robeson, Rowan, Sampson, Scotland, Stanly, Tyrrell, Union, Wayne, Wilson and Yancey.**
- Government entities and non-profit organizations must provide a formal Request for Public Assistance to the State of North Carolina to be considered for a grant. The deadlines are:

- Private Non-Profits (PNPs) and Houses of Worship (HOWs) do not have a separate deadline. Their deadline is dependent upon the county in which they are located.
