Navigating the Road to Recovery

- **The deadline for North Carolinians to register for disaster assistance from FEMA and for low-interest disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration has been extended one week to 11:59 p.m., Wednesday, Dec. 19, 2018.** FEMA granted the extension at the request of Gov. Roy Cooper.
- Total federal assistance approved for Hurricane Florence has surpassed **\$1 billion**.
- The Disaster Recovery Centers in **Craven, Onslow and Robeson counties** closed **yesterday, Thursday, Dec. 13**. The New Hanover County recovery center located in Wilmington will remain open until further notice.

Scope

- **34** counties designated for Individual Assistance
- **51** counties designated for Public Assistance (Categories A-G)
- **All Hurricane Florence shelters closed Nov. 9** (peak population 21,272 on Sept. 15)

Recovery Update

- **Total state and federal resources approved: More than \$1 billion**
- **FEMA Individuals and Households grants: \$120.2 million** approved for homeowners and renters
 - **Housing Assistance** approved: **\$99.4 million** for **33,503** households
 - **Other Needs Assistance** approved: **\$20.8 million**
- **U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster loans approved: \$340.7 million** for **8,647** applicants
 - **\$297.1 million** in loans approved for **7,906** homeowners and renters
 - **\$43.6 million** in loans approved for **741** business owners
- **National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) estimated claims paid: \$554.4 million**

- **FEMA inspectors** in the field: **27**
- **FEMA inspections** completed: **100,471 (99 percent) of 101,385 assigned**
- **Disaster Recovery Center** visits: **41,593**
- **Disaster Survivor Assistance** teams have completed their mission. They visited **113,069** homes, registered **4,901** survivors and made **5,116** case updates and inquiries.
- **As of Dec. 13, Direct Housing Units** licensed in: **324**
- **Transitional Sheltering Assistance: 368** households with **1,038** household members checked into TSA-participating hotels.

SBA disaster loan application deadlines

The deadline for filing an SBA application for low-interest disaster loans for physical damage as a result of Hurricane Florence is Wednesday, **Dec. 19, 2018**. The deadline to return economic injury disaster loan applications is **June 14, 2019**.

Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA)

The [Transitional Sheltering Assistance](#) program provides short-term hotel stays to survivors who were displaced from their homes and need shelter while they look for longer-term housing. Survivors will be notified of their eligibility through an automated phone call, text message, and/or email depending upon the method of communication they selected when they registered for assistance. Or call the disaster assistance helpline at **800-621-3362** or **800-462-7585 (TTY)**.

- TSA is available to eligible survivors whose pre-disaster primary residence is in one of the following **nine** counties: **Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Jones, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender or Robeson.**

Direct Temporary Housing Assistance

FEMA is providing Direct Temporary Housing Assistance in **13** counties: **Bladen, Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Duplin, Jones, Lenoir, New Hanover, Onslow, Pamlico,**

Pender and Robeson. Travel trailers and manufactured housing units are provided for eligible households displaced from their homes.

Disaster Tax Relief

Survivors of Hurricane Florence may qualify for tax relief from the Internal Revenue Service. Taxpayers may be eligible for deadline extensions to file returns or pay taxes, and may be able to claim qualified disaster losses. The IRS may waive fees and expedite requests from survivors. Unmet Needs

FEMA works closely with state, federal, faith-based and voluntary agency partners. Survivors who do not qualify for FEMA disaster assistance may call **2-1-1**, the statewide information and referral service for basic unmet needs—such as food or cleaning supplies and help to pay utility bills and child-care expenses.

National Flood Insurance Program

- To help speed recovery, the [National Flood Insurance Program](#) is allowing advanced payments to policyholders on their flood insurance claims.
- Policyholders who contact their insurer can receive an advance payment of up to \$5,000 on a flood claim, without an adjuster visit or additional documentation.
- NFIP policyholders who have not yet filed a claim should call their agent or insurance company and file immediately. Policyholders who need assistance contacting their insurance company can contact the NFIP Call Center at **800-427-4661**.

Public Assistance

- FEMA's Public Assistance program provides grants to state, local and tribal governments, and to certain types of private nonprofit organizations so that communities can quickly respond to and recover from major disasters or emergencies.
- The following **51** counties are eligible to apply for all categories of Public Assistance: **Alamance, Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Cabarrus, Carteret, Chatham, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Dare, Davidson, Duplin, Granville, Greene, Guilford, Harnett, Hoke, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Madison, McDowell, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Orange, Pamlico, Pender, Person, Pitt, Polk, Randolph, Richmond, Robeson, Rowan, Sampson, Scotland, Stanly, Tyrrell, Union, Wayne, Wilson and Yancey.**
- Government entities and non-profit organizations must provide a formal Request for Public Assistance to the State of North Carolina to be considered for a grant. The deadlines are:
 - **Nov. 11:** *Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Cabarrus, Chatham, Dare, Granville, Montgomery, Person, Randolph, Stanly, Union and Yancey counties.*
 - **Nov. 16:** *Beaufort, Bladen, Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Duplin, Greene, Harnett, Hoke, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Pamlico, Pender, Pitt, Richmond, Robeson, Sampson, Scotland, Wayne and Wilson counties.*
 - **Nov. 21:** *Bertie, Davidson and Orange counties.*
 - **Nov. 23:** *Alamance, Madison, Polk, Rowan and Tyrrell counties.*
 - **Dec. 15:** *Guilford and McDowell counties.*

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- Private Non-Profits (PNPs) and Houses of Worship (HOWs) do not have a separate deadline. Their deadline is dependent upon the county in which they are located.
